- i. The Mebile County District Attorney's office gradted testimonial immunity to one Terrell Moore.
- 2. Terroll Moore confessed to planning and participating in the robbery of Valerie Finley, the victim in this case.
- 3. Terrell Moore disclosed detailed information that only a participant would know.
- 4. perrell Moore admitted that he was paid \$150.00 to drive to and from a planned burglary of the Finley nome.
  - 5. Tarrell Moore also admitted:
    - (a) doubling a mask;
    - (h) entering the Finley home;
    - (c) observing Angel, his accomplice, threaten Us. Finley;
    - (d) removing guns from the vault at the Finley home;
    - (a) placing those guas, along with a few preces of jevelry, into a pillowcase;
    - (f) picking up a .38 pistol from the headboard of a because
    - (g) discovering a lock on the back door;
    - (b) hearing the gunshot that entered Ms. Finley's hear:
    - (i) seeing the resulting wou das she lay on the floor;
    - (j) arguing with Angel, the shooter;
    - (m) having to unlock the back door;
    - (1) removing his mask before exiting the home;
    - (m) running to his car;
    - (a) loading the pillowcase, filled with puns and jewell, and determined mis Mercury Capri;
    - (a) Packing out of the Finley's driveway;
    - (s) backing very near to someone working on a car (c. 14) office (Tinley's house was rituated on a cul-de-sid).

- c) the guns and jewelry, and why he had lied about how he got the cache (The lie: that Rene had called to tell where the guns ware, when Donnard Jones actually told Petitioner but threatened to Stans him if his (Dennard Jones) name were mentioned to police.
