SPECIFIC POLYGRAPH EXAMINATION

DATE & PLACE OF EXAMINATION:

This polygraph examination was conducted at the request of KEN NIXON, ATTORNEY. The polygraph examination was conducted on APRIL 20, 1995 at the offices of COMPU-SCREEN SYSTEMS, INC., DAPHNE, ALABAMA.

PURPOSE OF THE EXAMINATION:

The purpose of this polygraph examination is to determine if examinee lied about the robbery and shooting of Mrs. Findley.

PRE-EXAMINATION INTERVIEW:

Prior to the examination, an agreement granting permission for the examination was signed by examinee. An explanation of the polygraph instrument was provided to examinee and each of the questions to be asked during the polygraph examination was thoroughly reviewed.

During the pre-test interview, examinee made the following statement:

"I recall that on the day that Mrs. Findley was robbed and shot, that I worked with B.F.I. from about 3:00 a.m. until 12:00 noon. I remember that I was at home that afternoon when Donald Jones, a friend, called me. Jones said that Angel and Tyrell had robbed my friend Mike Finley's house. I asked him where the two men were at the time of the call and he said they were both at the bus station. Since I was friendly with the Finley's, I decided to go to the bus station to see if I could recover the guns they were supposed to have stolen from the Finley's. I do recall that right after Jones told me what happened, Mike Finley called me and asked me where my friends were. I then told him about Jones' call to me. I also told him I would try to get his guns back. No one told me at this time that Mrs. Finley had been shot. I then went to the bus station where I talked with Rene, who was at the bus station with Angel, but who was not

with him during the crime. Renee told me that Donald Jones knew where the guns were hidden. I then went to Donalds' house. I talked with Donald and convinced him to turn the guns over to me to give back to the Finley's. I then drove Donald, at his direction, to an old friend of Donalds in Creighton. Donald went in the back yard of that house and pulled out the guns from under that house. I drove Donald back home and drove to the Finley's house with the guns. Mike was not home, but I spoke with a neighbor outside, his name was Tyrone Dorch. Dorch said he knew Mike was not home. He did comment that he had seen the get-away-car from the robbery, as it left his neighborhood. I told Dorch to tell Mike to come to my house when he got home. I got home and about 6:00 p.m., Mike called me. He said his wife was shot during the robbery. He asked me if I had seen the robbers at the bus station. I told him I did not see them there, because I had just learned of his wife being shot and I sort of panicked to find it was more serious than I first thought. At this time I did not mention the guns, for fear he would think that I was involved. I then, the next day, took the stolen property to some bushes around the corner from Finley's house and dropped the property there. I then went to Mike and told him that they had told me where the guns were at. Mike then got his property back. The reason I lied to Mike and to the police was because Donald Jones threatened that he would involve me in the crime if I told the truth. Later I recorded Donalds conversation with me on the phone, whereby he made the threat to involve me. I then felt I could tell the truth, which I did do to Mike and to the police. I did not rob or go with the robbers to rob and shoot Mrs. Finley. I did not know this was to happen and I have told all I know about that incident. I have had no part in any plans to kill Mrs. Finley and I never heard of any such plans. I know of no such plans by Mike Finley or anyone else."s/Rodney Stanberry
